

# Announcement of training material

A free e-learning platform for representatives of the food supply sector is a practical guide to help them to reduce food waste.

Therefore a brokering platform, ereading handbooks and a mini game has been developed.

The brokering platform is a market place for producers and charities. It is a possibility for producers to offer unsold food, which charities can receive before it expires. The e-reading handbooks are divided into three categories which have several chapters. This means that there are modules available for companies on how to prevent food waste as well as donation. Apart from that are modules available for charities about receiving donation. The content of the modules focuses e.g. on logistic aspects, tax and regulation, marketing etc.

After reading each handbook there is a short multiple choice questionnaire. By answering maximal five questions the reader can test his previously gained knowledge.

At least the mini game is designed to visualize the donation process in a very simple manner. The task is to store food donations in a warehouse and further distribute them to food banks in need. If there occurs a problem (e.g. food gets wasted before the distribution) notification appears that draws the connection the e-reading to handbooks.

All three parts contribute into a whole e-learning platform.



#### Launch pilot test

All partners will be testing the e-learning platform with minimal 15 companies and five food banks. The test period starts in May and lasts until the end of July 2014. The pilot should be tested via a survey that companies and charities fill in based on seeing the e-learning platform. The survey contains questions about the brokering platform, the e-reading handbooks and the mini game. Therefore the user gives feedback on the appearance of the platform, the user-friendly handling and the learning niveau. This helps to evaluate and improve the benefit for the user and to adapt the remarks to get a final version of the e-learning platform.
